If a child is not coming to school, please ring, send a note with a sibling or even better yet, download our school app, SKOOL LOOP and use the ABSENTEE option to inform the school.

It is school policy to contact parents if we have an unexplained absence. Please note that parents are legally obliged to provide a written explanation for children's absences.

The Principal has a legal obligation to report all children who are absent for more than 20 days in a school year and also those children whose attendance is

erratic or giving the school cause for concern, whether they have missed 20 days or not.
